1. Background. This document provides guidance to healthcare facilities on the management of visitors to reduce the risk of transmission of SARS-CoV-2, also known as COVID-19 virus, to visitors of patients with suspected or confirmed COVID-19. This document also considers preventing introduction of SARS-CoV2 into healthcare facilities by visitors during periods of community transmission; the risk of introduction into facilities increases as community transmission becomes more widespread.

Management of Visitors to Healthcare Facilities in the

Visit parks and recreation areas that are close to your home. Don’t visit crowded parks or campgrounds. Carefully consider use of playgrounds, and help children follow guidelines. Stay at least 6 feet away from people you don’t live with. Wear a mask. Wash your hands often and don’t share items with people you don’t live with.
